ORDER

Petition and Accusation, Answer and Stipulation having been filed herein, the matter came duly on for hearing before the Supreme Court, in Chambers, Oscar R. Knutson, Chief Justice, presiding, in the State Capitol, in the City of Saint Paul, on the 5th day of October, 1971. The Court being fully advised in the premises, and the matter having been approved by a Panel of the State Board of Professional Responsibility, now upon motion of R. B. Reavill, as Administrative Director on Professional Conduct, Petitioner herein, concurred in by Respondent, Michael J. Goggins, and upon the Stipulation between the respective parties in this proceeding, makes the following Orders:

1. Respondent Michael J. Goggins is hereby, and as of this date, placed on probation until further Order of the Court, the terms of the probation to be that Respondent refrain from the practice of law except as an employee of Associated Bureaus, Inc., Allied Medical Audit Control, Inc., Credit Convertors, Inc., and such subsidiaries as may now be or hereafter be created which may be controlled in whole or in part by said enumerated corporations.

2. That as an employee of the above named companies or otherwise, Respondent refrain from any conduct in violation of the Code of Professional Responsibility of the American Bar Association, as adopted by the Supreme Court of Minnesota.

3. That if Respondent's employment with his present employer is terminated, Respondent shall accept no other employment involving the practice of law without first having obtained the written consent of the Administrative Director on Professional Conduct.

4. That Respondent make monthly reports of his activities to the Administrative Director on Professional Conduct.

5. Upon a showing to the Court that Respondent has violated any of the terms and conditions of his probation, he shall be forthwith suspended indefinitely from the practice of law in Minnesota. Such showing may be made by affidavits or otherwise and without any hearing before a Referee or any formal hearing before the Supreme Court.
