ORDER

By order of this court dated February 7, 1986, the respondent George C. Gubbins, Jr. was suspended from the practice of law for a period of four months commencing February 14, 1986. Since that time he has remained on a suspended status. The court's opinion and order suspending the respondent imposed certain conditions precedent to his reinstatement. Those conditions included successfully passing the Multi-State Examination on Professional Responsibility; remaining current in Continuing Legal Education requirements; engaging a certified public accountant to audit the financial affairs of his practice and to assist him in the installation of a system of books and accounts that fully meets the bookkeeping requirements of the court and the Board; furnishing written proof including the accountant's report satisfactory to the Director that the respondent's system of books and accounts fully meet the bookkeeping requirements. The respondent has filed an affidavit with the court and other documents furnishing proof that he has complied with those conditions. The Director has filed with the court an affidavit substantiating the respondent's claims and indicating no objection to the reinstatement.

Based upon those affidavits, IT IS ORDERED:

That the respondent forthwith as of the date of this order is reinstated to the general practice of law in the State of Minnesota.


