**PETITION FOR
DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

TO THE SUPREME COURT OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

The Director of the Office of Lawyers Professional Responsibility, hereinafter Director, files this petition seeking reciprocal discipline pursuant to Rule 12(d), Rules on Lawyers Professional Responsibility. The Director alleges:

The above-named attorney, hereinafter respondent, was admitted to practice law in Minnesota on May 3, 1991. Respondent currently practices law in Superior, Wisconsin.

On October 18, 2007, respondent was publicly disciplined by the Wisconsin Supreme Court. As more fully set forth in that court's order attached hereto as Exhibit 1, the basis for this discipline was illegal drug use with clients, including a client in a criminal matter whose conditions of release included no drug use; engaging in sexual relations with a client's girlfriend to pay the client's legal bill to respondent; misuse of a client trust account; failure to maintain proper trust account records; and criminal conviction for possession of marijuana. Respondent's misconduct, as stated in Exhibit 1, violated Rules 1.7(b), 1.15(a), (e) and (g), 8.4(b) and 8.4(c), Minnesota Rules of Professional Conduct.

WHEREFORE, the Director respectfully prays for an order of this Court directing that respondent and the Director inform the Court within thirty days of its order

whether either or both believe the imposition of identical discipline by the Minnesota Supreme Court would be unwarranted and the reasons for that claim.


