**STIPULATION FOR
RECIPROCAL DISCIPLINE**

THIS STIPULATION is entered into by and between Martin A. Cole, Director of the Office of Lawyers Professional Responsibility, hereinafter Director, and Robert M. Light, attorney, hereinafter respondent.

WHEREAS, respondent has concluded it is in respondent's best interest to enter into this stipulation,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the undersigned as follows:

1. It is understood that respondent has certain rights pursuant to Rule 12(d), Rules on Lawyers Professional Responsibility (RLPR). Respondent waives those rights and agrees to the Court's immediate issuance of an order for reciprocal discipline consistent with this stipulation. Respondent hereby admits service of the amended petition for disciplinary action seeking reciprocal discipline.

2. Respondent unconditionally admits the allegations of the amended petition which may be summarized as follows: On May 14, 2009, respondent was disbarred by the North Dakota Supreme Court. Respondent's disbarment was based upon: missed appointments; the closure of respondent's office during normal business hours and during scheduled appointments; respondent's clients' inability to contact him about work he promised to do and was performing on their behalf; respondent's late arrival and unpreparedness for a jury trial; respondent's conviction of a class C felony (terrorizing); and respondent's submission of false statements during the North Dakota disciplinary process. Respondent's misconduct violated the North Dakota Rules of Professional Conduct, and also violated Rules 1.3, 1.4, 1.15, 8.1 and 8.4(b) and (e), Minnesota Rules of Professional Conduct.

3. Respondent understands that by entering into this stipulation, the Director is not making any representations as to the sanction the Court will impose.

4. The Director and respondent join in recommending that the appropriate discipline is disbarment pursuant to Rule 15, RLPR. Respondent agrees to the imposition and payment of \$900 in costs pursuant to Rule 24, RLPR.

5. This stipulation is entered into by respondent freely and voluntarily, without any coercion, duress or representations by any person except as contained herein.

6. Respondent hereby acknowledges receipt of a copy of this stipulation.

7. Respondent has been advised by the undersigned counsel concerning this stipulation and these proceedings generally.


