O R D E R

On May 16, 2014, the Director of the Office of Lawyers Professional Responsibility filed a petition for disciplinary action alleging that respondent Paul Roland Rambow committed professional misconduct warranting public discipline. The Director filed a supplementary petition on July 25, 2014, and a second supplementary petition on October 24, 2014. We deemed the allegations in the supplementary petition admitted, *see* Rule 13(b), Rules on Lawyers Professional Responsibility (RLPR), and referred the matter to a referee for findings of fact, conclusions of law, and recommendations for disposition. After a hearing, the referee found that respondent violated Minn. R. Prof. Conduct 1.3, 1.4(a) and (b), 1.5(a), 1.6(a), 1.7(a)(2), 1.15(a), (b), (c)(3), (c)(4), and (h), as interpreted by Appendix 1 thereto, 1.16(d), 3.2, 3.3(a)(1), 3.4(c), 4.1, 5.3(a), (b), and (c), 5.5(a), 8.1(a) and (b), and 8.4(c) and (d), and Rule 25, RLPR. The referee recommended that respondent be disbarred.

The Director has now filed a petition for interim suspension pursuant to Rule 16(e), RLPR. Respondent has not filed a response to the Rule 16(e) petition.

Rule 16(e), RLPR, provides that, upon a referee's recommendation of disbarment, "the lawyer's authority to practice law shall be suspended pending final determination of the disciplinary proceeding, unless the referee directs otherwise or the Court orders otherwise."

Based upon all the files, records, and proceedings herein,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that respondent Paul Roland Rambow is temporarily suspended from the practice of law, effective as of the date of the filing of this order, pending final resolution of this matter. Respondent shall comply with Rule 26, RLPR (requiring notice of suspension to clients, opposing counsel, and tribunals).
